

#### **One-Time COVID Relief Funding Over Several Years**

One-time state and federal COVID relief funding will provide approximately \$6.5M **to use over several years** for costs associated with responding to COVID and its ongoing impacts. Funds were used to cover a broad range of expenses for safety equipment and supplies, learning costs and resources to keep staff and students connected.
